Background:

Before moving, his parents contacted a third-party agency that matches students for housing purposes, and he now sublets a room in a 2-bedroom apartment from Ben. Jiang and Ben get along well enough, but are not necessarily close friends.

Challenge:

After coming home from class one day, Ben tells Jiang that he must move out in 10 days because Ben's friend will be moving into Jiang's room. Jiang does not have anywhere else to stay and it is nearly impossible for him to find a new apartment or move on such short notice. He is also worried that his housing situation may affect his student visa. Since his housing situation was handled by the third-party agency, he does not know if his lease allows Ben to do this.

Solution:
